

### Can You Explain the 4-to-1 Rule for Setting Up an Extension Ladder?

### **Description**

The 4-to-1 rule for setting up an extension ladder states that for every four feet of height you have to climb, you should move the base of the ladder one foot away from the wall or object itâ??s leaning against.

# **Understanding the 4-to-1 Rule**

The 4-to-1 rule is a standard safety guideline in the construction and maintenance industry. Itâ??s designed to ensure the stability of the ladder and prevent it from tipping over. Hereâ??s how it works:

A ladder set too steeply can fall backward, while a ladder set too shallow can slide out at the base. Both scenarios can lead to serious accidents. Therefore, always remember the 4-to-1 rule when setting up an extension ladder.

# **Additional Ladder Safety Tips**

- Always maintain three points of contact (two hands and a foot, or two feet and a hand) when climbing or descending a ladder.
- Never exceed the maximum load rating of a ladder. It includes the climberâ??s weight plus any equipment or materials being carried.
- Avoid using ladders in adverse weather conditions, such as wind or rain.
- Regularly inspect ladders for any damage or wear and tear before use.
