# Mac Demolition Ltd Fined £60,000 for Breaching Construction Regulations

## Description

On November 2, 2023, Mac Demolition Ltd, a Middlesex-based demolition company, was fined £60,000 for breaching the Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015. ## Breach of Regulations

Companies need to be aware that we will not hesitate to take appropriate enforcement action against those that fall below the required standards.”
